Oecusse, East Timor

Short History:

- Original inhabitants arrived in Timor leste 50,000 years ago.
- 1515 Portuguese invaded & settled in Oecusse.
- 1940-45 Timorese assisted Australian soldiers in the fight against Japanese forces.
- 1974 Due to domestic issues Portugal withdraws from Timor leste.
- 1975 Indonesia violently invaded whilst USA, Australia and Britain watched on. 25 years of resistance followed.
- 1999 UN led referendum for independence; retreating Indonesian troops and local militia wreaked havoc on the country.
- 1999 Australian lead INTERFET arrived and secured safety.
- 2000 UN count showed 500,000 East Timorese, more than half the population "missing presumed killed" during the Indonesian invasion.
- 2002 East Timor declared a new, independent nation.
- Now a new democracy struggling with traumatised and displaced population, poverty, lack of infrastructure, lack of administrational capacity and sadly the blight of corruption.



Climate

8 months of no rain in the dry season followed by 4 months of heavy rain in the wet season.

The majority of people who live in Oecusse are subsistence farmers – growing rice on the river flats and corn in the drier mountain regions.







Current Conditions



- 30% of the population suffers from severe - acute malnutrition.
- 12% of children die before their 5th birthday, mainly due to drinking contaminated water.
- Third worst rate of childhood malnutrition in the world – better only than Yemen and Afghanistan.
- 44% of the population does not have adequate food, clothing, shelter.
- 84% of the population does not have adequate sanitation.
- 41% of the population is classified as poor as they live on less than \$1.50 a day.
- 40% of the population is under 20.
- 84% of the wealth of the country is in the hands of 8% of the population.

Clean Water, Pumps & Water Tanks

One of the major problems affecting the health and well being of the people of Oecusse is the lack of portable water. Water borne diseases such as dysentery, gastro-enteritis and diarrhoea are endemic. Since 2001 OzGREEN/GREENTL has been testing water sources and in that time has found that 95% do not comply with World Health Organisation standards for clean drinking water, many are considered too severely contaminated for human contact. To address these issues Judy, relied on her research and ingenuity (as a Geologist) to design a small, **household bio-sand filtration unit**.

A bio sand filtration unit is simply a large container, (plastic barrel or cement tank) containing specific layers of pebbles, grit and fine sand. Water poured into the top of the unit slowly percolates through the sand and grit to a pipe in the bottom of the container. Hydrostatic pressure pushes the water up to the outlet tap from where it can be collected.



GREENTL has tested these in many villages and the results are excellent. Water testing consistently shows a near 100% reduction in faecal coliforms and 100% reduction in turbidity. Village women constantly tell us, *"Now our water looks better, tastes better, our children are not as sick and the rice tastes better."*

A single unit will provide a family with clean drinking water for many years.



Well Rehabilitation, Reforestation & Fish Farms

The other most common actions to come out of the VEAP (Village Environmental Action Planning) process are well rehabilitation, reforestation and irrigation for vegetable gardens. Since colonisation Timor Leste has been largely cleared of its forests and is therefore heavily impacted by the effects of erosion. Planting trees helps stabilise the land and helps provide a source of food and income.

GREENTL has funded and advised on a fish farm in a local village, Toulica, and another is underway in Mahatta. GREENTL supplies the funds, the locals supply the labour and the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries provides the fish.


