If you get a toothache in rural Papua New Guinea, often the only treatment available is painkillers.

**Karo Haltmeier**, from the **Rotary Club of Kenthurst**, is looking to change this by setting up the first rural dental clinic.

The location is Korogu Village, Karo's hometown, a remote hamlet on the Sepik River in the northern sector of Papua New Guinea.

### **Project: Sepik Dental Clinic, PNG**

With rugged terrain, limited transport and a lack of infrastructure, medical services are already limited throughout this region and it is easy to understand why.



Getting there is no easy task – a flight to Wewak, many hours of bouncing on windy roads through variable terrain, then a long boat ride along the Sepik River.




Karo told us that for the 200,000 Papua New Guineans living along the River there are no dental services. Once the clinic is built, they will travel there by canoe, the standard method of transport, it is the area's "highway".

The **Kenthurst Rotary Club** has plans in place to build a dental clinic, with a surgery and accommodation, and to provide volunteer dentists which will improve the health prospects of the population.

They are working hard to raise \$50,000 which will assist in the building of the facility and purchase of dental equipment.

Dental Clinic site

A site, adjacent to the school, has been chosen and it is on high ground which is dry year round. The Sepik frequently floods so the location is paramount.

The villagers are so excited about this project they have already sourced timber, transported it to the mill and returned to site so construction can begin as soon as possible.

Volunteer dentists from Australia and from other parts of the world will be organised through NGO Project Sepik which is the projects local contact and partner. The local community will accommodate volunteers and feed them during their stay.

This will be the first dental clinic in PNG to serve the rural population and will serve as an example to local provincial governments of how dental treatment can be achieved for minimal funds.

Accompanying Karo to our Club was her husband Patrick and dental supplier Mike O'Connell who has visited Korogu and plans to return to set up the clinic.

The equipment that will be sent includes fold out dental chair, portable "dental clinic in a suitcase". Two of these 24kg units will be sent, as well as consumables.

They hope it will set an example for PNG health authorities to adopt an operating model for other areas. There is a long-term goal of staffing the clinics with locally trained dentists.

### SEPIK RIVER DENTAL CLINIC PROJECT KENTHURST ROTARY CLUB NEEDS YOUR DONATION

200,000 Papua New Guineans living along the Sepik River in the north of PNG have no access to dental services.


